<u>Community For ALL Ages</u> — During the Board of Aldermen meeting on Monday, December 5, the City of Harrisonville was named as a Bronze level Community for All Ages!

Harrisonville is one of four Kansas City area cities being honored by the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) for becoming more age friendly. Bonner Springs, KS; and Westwood, KS, were also recognized with Bronze Level awards.

Parkville, MO, earned Silver Level status.



The Communities for All Ages program was developed to help communities respond to a rapid increase in the older adult

population, and make communities more welcoming for all age groups. The program's three levels of achievement reflect increasing degrees of commitment to becoming a Community for All Ages. The Bronze Level recognizes increased awareness of



age and requires a resolution or commitment by the City's elected body, along with community presentations and

public engagement. The program encourages communities to respond positively to changing demographics and adopt policy and programs that make the region a great place to live and age well.

"Harrisonville prides itself in being a welcoming community for all ages," Mayor Judy Bowman said. "Residents and City officials recognize the value of older individuals, their knowledge and experiences. Working with Communities for All Ages enables Harrisonville to utilize tried and tested practices to both create and sustain an age-friendly place."

NEW Community Improvement Grant Program —

Hey homeowners, we want to remind you about some exciting news for you. Beginning in 2023, the City's Community Development Department will be offering a Community Improvement Grant program!

The new program awards grants as reimbursements

for construction costs for exterior improvements to existing houses. Improvements can include: Roof repair/ replacement, New



paint or siding, New windows, Foundation work, etc. Based on the type of project, a building permit may be required. Permit fees are waived for grant projects requiring permits.

If awarded, grants will reimburse 25-percent of the total project cost, up to a maximum \$2,500.

To participate in the program, the house will need to be owner-occupied and must have an appraised full market value no more than \$140,000 for the primary building (not including land).
