Changes at City Hall — On April 2, 2019, you, as Harrisonville residents, went to the polls to decide the future of our City. Through your civic duty, Judy Bowman was elected as the 38th Mayor of the City of Harrisonville! Bowman enters the role with a strong knowledge of Harrisonville, after serving as a Ward 1 Aldermen for the previous four years and living here for six years. Bowman was sworn in as Mayor during the April 15, Board meeting. She will be the first woman to hold the office of Mayor in Harrisonville.



The City of Harrisonville would like to thank Brian Hasek for his strong leadership during his time as Mayor and look forward to continued growth and success with Bowman at the helm!

Voters also decided the four open seats on the City's Board, electing David Doerhoff as a Ward 1 Aldermen (filling Bowman's seat), Clint Miller as a Ward 3 Aldermen, Gary Davidson as a Ward 4 Aldermen and re-electing Marcia Milner to her seat as an Aldermen in Ward 2.

We would like to thank outgoing aldermen Clint Long (Ward 3) and Jessica Levsen (Ward 4) for their dedicated service to our City & their work to maintain Harrisonville as a great place to live for years to come!

Spring Clean-Up May 10 & 11 – The annual City-Wide Clean-Up will be held May 10 & 11. Bring your unwanted items to 2606 Rock Haven Road and drop them off for FREE! *Accepted items:* non-Freon appliances and metal items, water heaters, furniture, light construction debris, limited to one 16-foot trailer, and household trash. This year, Freon appliances will be

accepted, for a \$10 charge. *Items not accepted:* tires, auto batteries, oil, hazardous chemicals, paint, roofing shingles and yard waste. The event is only available for those who live within the city limits. Residents will be able to bring items from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. To participate, residents will be required to provide proof of residency within the incorporated City limits of Harrisonville. For example, a City of Harrisonville utility billing statement. Municipal Waste Services would also like to remind residents that they will pick up one bulky item per month, for free. 2019 Sidewalk & Curb Program – The Harrisonville Streets Department’s 2019 Sidewalk and Curb Program is officially underway and some of you will soon see work being done in your neighborhood. During the project, Terry Snelling Construction will be taking out damaged sidewalk and curb and replacing it. No roads



will be closed but residents may have limited access to driveways and sidewalks and be unable to park along curbs, while crews are in the

area. After work is completed in a neighborhood, crews will announce where they plan to work next. Residents living in areas where work will be done will be notified 48 hours in advance. Missouri One Call System will also be out marking utilities at least three days in advance of work in an area. Residents with special requests are asked to present them to the contractor. Those with concerns may call Streets Department Superintendent Rodney Jacobs (816) 380-8951.

City-Wide Garage Sale –The 2019 City-Wide Garage Sale will be Friday, May 3, and Saturday, May 4. We would like to remind residents who plan on hosting sales that garage-sale signs are allowed on your own property but should not be placed in the public right of way, on public corners. Permits are not required to hold a garage sale. For more information about the guidelines surrounding garage sales, please visit Section 215.2370 of the City Code. Please drive carefully & watch for pedestrians if you are out enjoying the sales.
